QUESTION OF: The situation of the Taliban occupation of Afghanistan

MAIN SUBMITTER: Russia

CO-SUBMITTERS: Indonesia, Belgium, Vietnam, Mexico, China

Junior Security Council,

Applauding that the United States is making an effort to stop the war by signing a deal with Afghanistan to rescue its soldiers,

Recognizing the United Nations who are supervising the deal,

Keeping in mind that the Taliban might not be necessarily evil since they are social policemen who are trying to protect against the abuse of religion,

Bearing in mind 45,000 Afghan defence officers were killed by the Taliban in the past 5 years,

Deeply disturbed by illegal offences committed by the Taliban such as but not limited to murder, terrorism, organizing massacre campaign, human trafficking, sexual oppression, religious discrimination, cultural genocide,

Expressing concern over the expeditious growth of terrorism in Afghanistan,

Stressing that Afghan citizens fear to step out of their houses every day,

Having considered the US-Taliban 2020 agreement which emphasises removing US troops from Afghanistan while preventing Al-Qaeda troops operating in areas under the Taliban's control and organizing talks with the Afghan government,

Taking note that the United States might have spread fake/exaggerated news about the Malala shooting as it is very hard for a professional assassin to fail their job and/or miss,

1. Suggests that Afghanistan and the Taliban construct a deal to end the war:
 - a. The deal includes the Taliban rightfully fighting for their country
 - b. The Taliban shall be conditioned to stop using violent methods to remain
 - c. In case the deal is violated, it is necessary to form treaties beforehand
 - i. Countries shall meet together to discuss the treaty; such as but not limited to:

1. Afghanistan
2. Taliban
3. The United States
4. Pakistan
5. Iran
6. Saudi Arabia
7. The United Arab Emirates
8. India

2. Recommends Afghanistan to supply their natural resources in order to ask for help:
 - a. Afghanistan has a reputation for oil mining and if they supply other countries with some of their natural resources they could ask for help
 - b. Help includes some troops guarding their borders and some troops looking out for terrorists;
3. Encourages the Taliban to surrender all possessed weapons through negotiation with the UN and Afghanistan;
4. Endorses strengthening military power in areas under the influence of the Taliban with the aid of G20 countries;
5. Calls upon the population of Afghanistan between the age of 18-30 of both genders to serve the military for 2 years;
 - a. This is only required until the Taliban occupation has been resolved
 - b. For citizens whose 30th anniversary is within less than 730 days after the law has been implemented shall still effectuate and would complete by their 32nd birthday
 - i. They may be given a 6-month extension before commencing
 - ii. Only applies if the person wishes to finish their military on their 30th birthday
 1. Those who don't finish will be given a punishment
 - c. Anyone who qualifies under the following category will not be required to serve in the military
 - i. Handicapped
 - ii. Have disabilities such as but not constrained to
 1. Blind
 2. Injured
 3. Deaf
 - iii. Pregnant
 1. Will not need to serve during the time being of their pregnancy
6. Endorses initiating charities to organize funds to create more schoolings and educating the children;
 - a. This will increase the number of educated people

- b. Establishing schools for girls should be prioritized as around 85 per cent of the women are not being educated currently in Afghanistan
 - c. This will reduce any violent thoughts or the promotion of terrorism
- 7. Calls upon the police of Afghanistan to prioritize solving any violent situation caused by the Taliban or in support of the Taliban;
 - a. A helpline can be introduced to report cases of the Taliban's involvement
 - b. This will stop the promotion of terrorism.
